FROM THE DESK OF PASTOR CHRIS (I AM AN ACTOR)

I am a Christian—I am a Jew—I am a Fireman--I am a nurse--I am a Soldier—I am a Priest

I AM AN ACTOR

The above title is from a commercial describing what television brings to us. It is important to keep a clear distinction between the person and the actor. An actor must get "into" the role but at the same time leave it on the set when the day is done.

Recently, we had the child of soap opera star Sonny from General Hospital come to our preschool. His name is actually Maurice Bernard, but we never refer to him as that. His role quickly becomes how we see him. There is even a slight intimidation because he plays a bad guy. Around the house, I have to often clarify if someone is going to prison or if it is the ongoing dialogue about Sonny.

In the church, we all have hats we wear. We'd like to think that they are all genuine representations of who we are, but that doesn't always happen. Sometimes labels get placed on someone because of who they are - as a cook that might be different as a Rector or Rectora. As a Pastor, I am a normal guy just like everyone else. There may be some sins I have refined, but you can always find others.

In the same way, Misery Synod is not in misery and the ELCA is not all homosexuals. AND, Cursillo is not in support of any one denomination, sect or political agenda. Our goal is to prepare leaders for the church by teaching fifteen lessons and five meditations, wrapped in an atmosphere of love. Sometimes we have to say no to some things because of the appearance, not necessarily the issue. It is our goal to keep Cursillo clean of the division that so easily entangle us. Unfortunately, just as Sonny gets a stereotype he doesn't deserve, Cursillo gets the same. We are full of sinners and thanks be to God HIS mercy is so great He can forgive. So many times throughout the Old and New Testament we see God overlooking sins. HE ignores the blatant stupidity of His people for the greater good. IN these times of economic disaster, the demise of Christianity in America, the resurgence of false theologies, it is easy for Satan to have his way. CURSILLO: GETTING IT RIGHT BY KILLING CATS

Dear Cursillo,

An Elder once told me a story about when he was young. He said he would steal a watermelon from Mr. Simpson's farm and he and his friends would go down to the local fishing hole to swim. They'd throw the watermelon in the water to get cold, tie a rope around a tree limb and tie the other end to an old tire they found in the woods. They'd spend the day playing, catching crawfish, and eating watermelon.

Today, a nosey mom in her SUV would call Code Enforcement and report the kids. They would then be sighted for trespassing. Signs would be posted to prevent whoever owned the land from being sued by anyone who got hurt at the lake. Then they would be sited for environmental issues as the tire was not properly recycled, and once found out, Farmer Simpson would file charges and the children would be sent to "juve" for theft and vandalism. Our country has lost its entire sense of play and it's not the videos games, it is us adults. Accidents happen and people die. We can't prevent sin and law suits change nothing. Our freedoms are stripped away daily and we "Blame" everyone and everything, when in reality the answer is in the very rule. "The Law kills, whether we're talking about the government's laws or the Law of God.

The Secretariat has an EXTREMELY difficult job and I liken it to herding cats. It's not just a bunch of the same cats, it's finicky cats, rebellious cats, opinionated cats, nosey cats, gentle cats, and every other kind of cat you can think of. The answer is to make more rules for our cats. The law will kill those cats we don't want and keep all the other cats in line. In reality the opposite is true.

Cursillo is a lay led ministry. That means we are pieces of God's body, "the church" coming together to form a special group of His body: "Cursillo", to serve the greater body, all the churches. Lay ministry is messy. They miss the litter box; they throw up on the rug and tear your furniture apart. Now we can de-claw and lock up these animals or we can embrace the reality that this is what it means to own cats. Accept that it is not always going to be right. Accept that cats will do things their way and a way in which they have been gifted to do it. I have NEVER heard one new kitten compliment us on the proficiency or organization of our ministry. It's not how the shrimp are arranged or even that there are shrimp, it is that someone cared enough to bring them and serve them. That is not to say that those who like proficiency should not have it, that would be to accept one gift over another. It is both styles working together!

Remember Farmer Simpson? The way he fixed things was with a shot gun. Those in charge make the decisions. THE GIFTS ARE IN THE PEOPLE, and the ministry is through us. When we come to serve, our 1st goal is to enable others to be their best NOT do it for them. Men can cook as well as women and women can lift and carry anything they want. One gender does not need to be rescued over another. Cursillo is beginning a legalistic curve. Let's get back to grace and love. Let's get back to celebrating gifts and if the weekend isn't "efficient" then so what? Our priority should be purity of doctrine and sharing God's grace. All the rest is just adding more litter to the litter box.

Love the pilgrims in their messiness. Be messy! Herding cats is messy. Loving cats is at times impossible. Cursillo is an amazing ministry of the laity. Power to the mixed breeds!

As I write this letter, the fact that I have been called to be Rector of LC128 has finally sunk in. It only took about 3 months. However, I still find the thought of leading a weekend very surreal. Like many who will read this, my pilgrim experience had a profound effect on my life. Many of you have heard my story, so I won't bore you with the details...again. To think that several years later I would be asked to be Rector still leaves me shaking my head. I am deeply humbled by the opportunity.

Several years before being asked to lead, the Lord put a verse on my heart during my daily reading of the Proverbs. I attended the second Alpha course offered at Grace and during the Holy Spirit weekend I gave my life to the Lord. While I was in prayer, I saw a beautiful path, with flowers along the path leading to a cross, thus the inspiration to the logo.

I attended Cursillo LC97 as a pilgrim. My eyes were opened to possibilities on how I could contribute to my church family, and boy did the possibilities start to trickle into my life. I was involved with Alpha as a table leader, head cook organizer, retreat organizer, and prayer team member. I then helped plant the Robinwood Church and was the communion "lady". I am also a member of a dynamic small group. We dig deep into the Word and we hold each other accountable in a loving way. I wanted to be involved and needed to be involved. You see, most of my friends, family, and husband are not Christians. Some have walked away from their Christian roots due to the Piety issue that can occur. Some haven't been exposed to the church in any manner. So, having my Christian Community has been my life line.

As we continue to prepare for the up-coming weekend, I look to our Lord to provide that guidance He has always given, the words He has always provided, and the unfailing love He always surrounds us with.
